ADMISSION CRITERIA: Member boarding schools recruit and select their own Davis Scholars. Each school is able to admit up to five new scholars per year in grades 10 and 11. Scholars are selected for their academic and leadership potential. Member schools seek to enroll Davis Scholars from countries that are underrepresented in their communities to enhance their geographic and cultural diversity.

COLLEGE FUNDING: **Davis International Scholars receive \$25,000 annually for both their boarding school years and for four years of undergraduate education, totaling up to \$175,000 for seven years.**
